The Australasian Faculty of Public Health Medicine (AFPHM) recently received a Commonwealth grant to increase the public health capacity of General Practice. As a result, six new funded advanced public health medicine training positions are being established to commence in January 2003.

Applicants must be general practitioners who have completed the coursework component of an MPH. The traineeships are three years full-time, and will lead to Fellowship of AFPHM. The locations and structure of the six traineeships are currently being finalised, and are expected to be advertised at the end of November.
