PH USA News Flash - Dr. Srinath Reddy Visits ASPH to Discuss PHFI

Dr. Srinath Reddy, professor and head of the Department of Cardiology at All India Institute of Medical Sciences, visited Washington, D.C., recently and met with Dr. Harrison Spencer (ASPH). The meeting was used to discuss the newly formed Public Health Foundation of India's (PHFI) plans to build capacity in India to create the capacity to train 10,000 people each year in public health; establish a network of five new schools of public health; strengthen existing schools of public health; create a pool of permanent faculty; establish an accreditation agency to standardize public health educational conduct research in high impact areas of public health facilitate policy development, program evaluation and advocacy on public health issues; and stimulate demand for public health professionals.
